Play, Learn, and Serve in the Great Outdoors

Time spent in the natural world can help build our physical, emotional, and family fitness. ~ Louv, 2011

Summer is almost here so it's time to take advantage of our local beautiful natural environment by getting outdoors! The natural environment holds remarkable potential for improving physical, psychological, and spiritual health, as well as strengthening bonds between people. However, research has shown that children are spending less time outdoors compared to twenty years ago. Let's plan to help our youth explore the great outdoors this summer!

4-H summer camp

Youth will be attending week long camps at Las Posadas this summer. Camps can spark curiosity, reconnect youth with nature, and emphasize holistic development of life skills. Last summer, parents of 4-H campers overwhelming reported two benefits for 4-H summer camp: unplugging from technology & becoming more confident.

Plan 4-H picnics, hikes, and exploration
